The Trust employs over 3,500 staff with most services provided from two main acute hospital sites in Colchester - Colchester General Hospital and Essex County Hospital.</p> <p>Colchester Hospital University NHS Foundation Trust mainly provides care for the people of four towns and their surrounding areas – Colchester, Clacton on Sea, Harwich and Halstead (a market town to the west of Colchester). The newly configured North Essex PCT covers this area and works closely with the Trust. The standard of general practice is high and many of the GP trainees from the Trust have taken up jobs in the district. The total local population is around 360,000 (about 70,000 children).</p>
