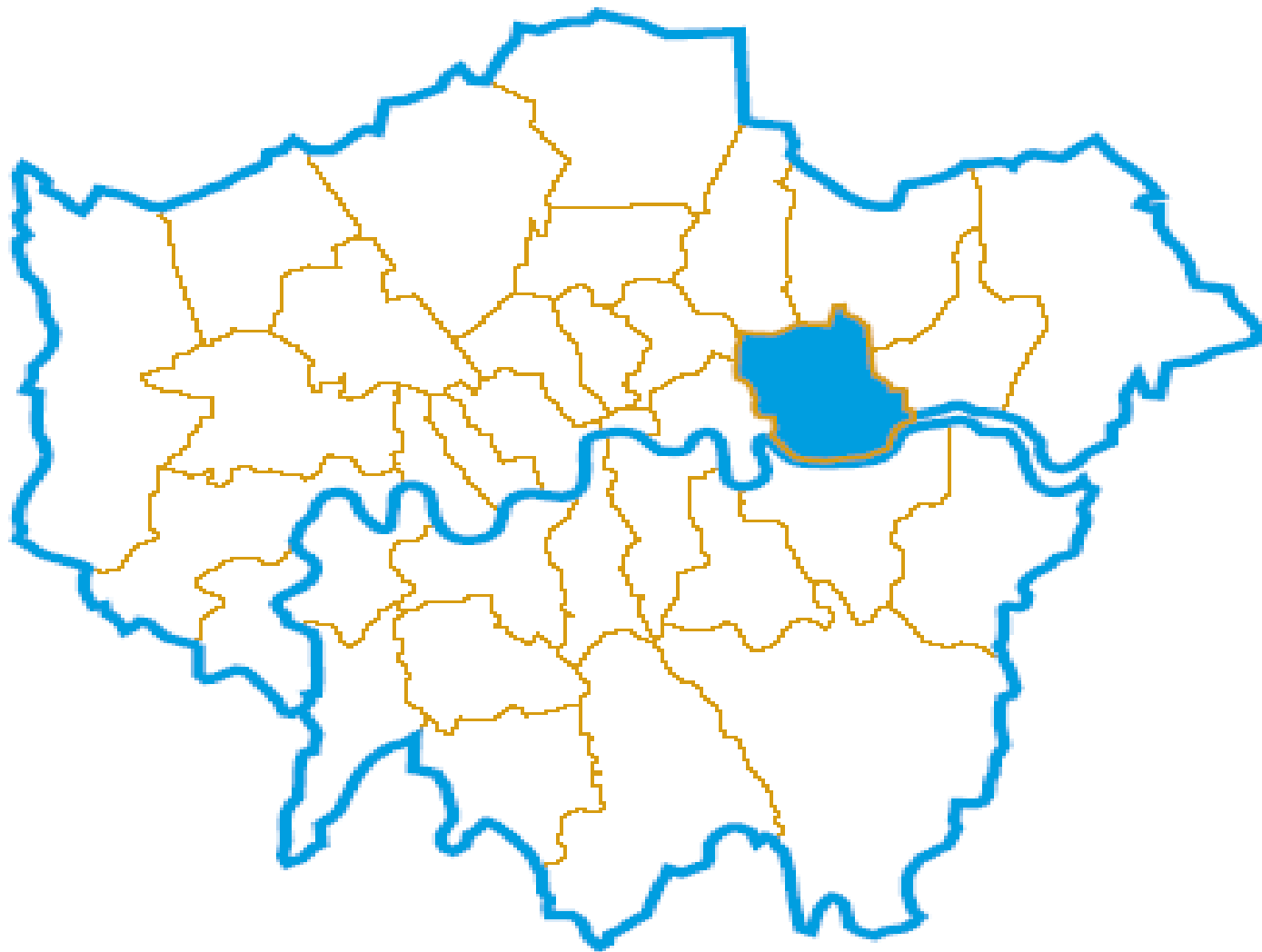

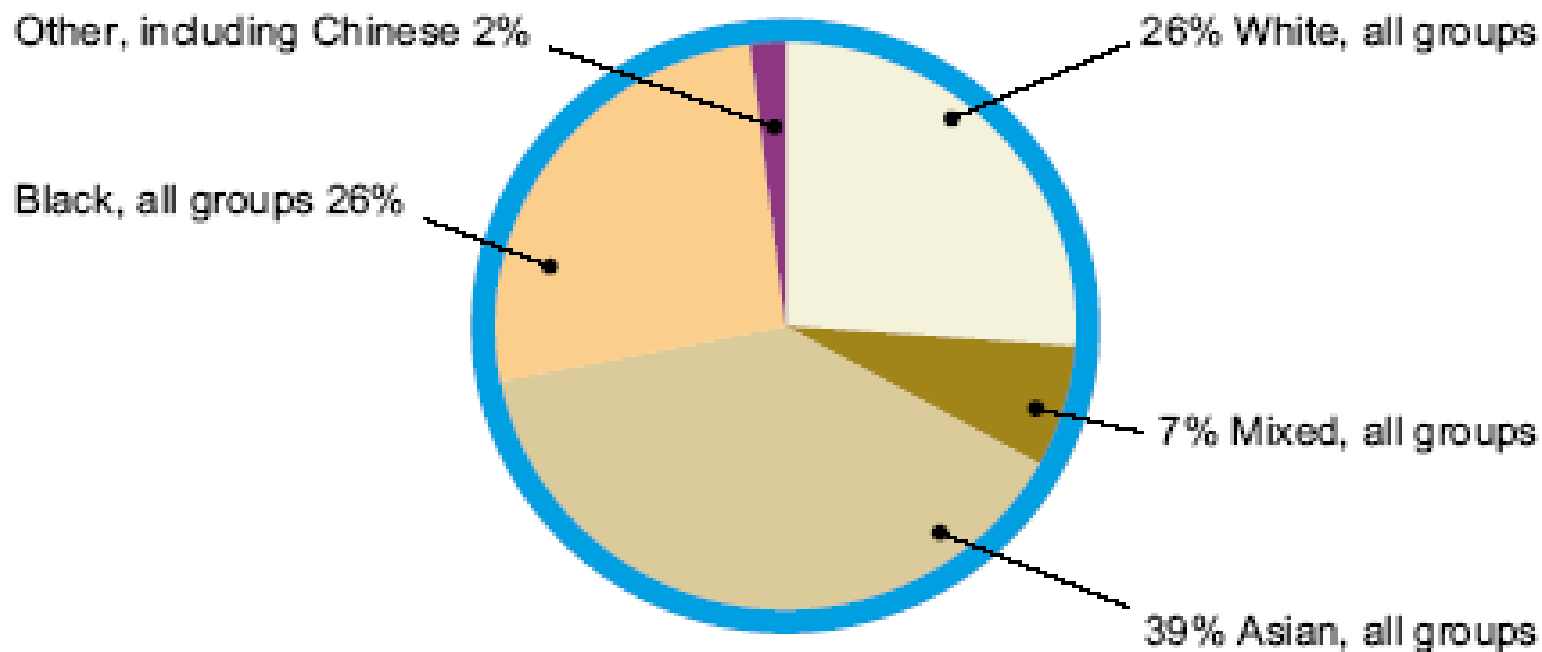

Newham – Key Facts (1)

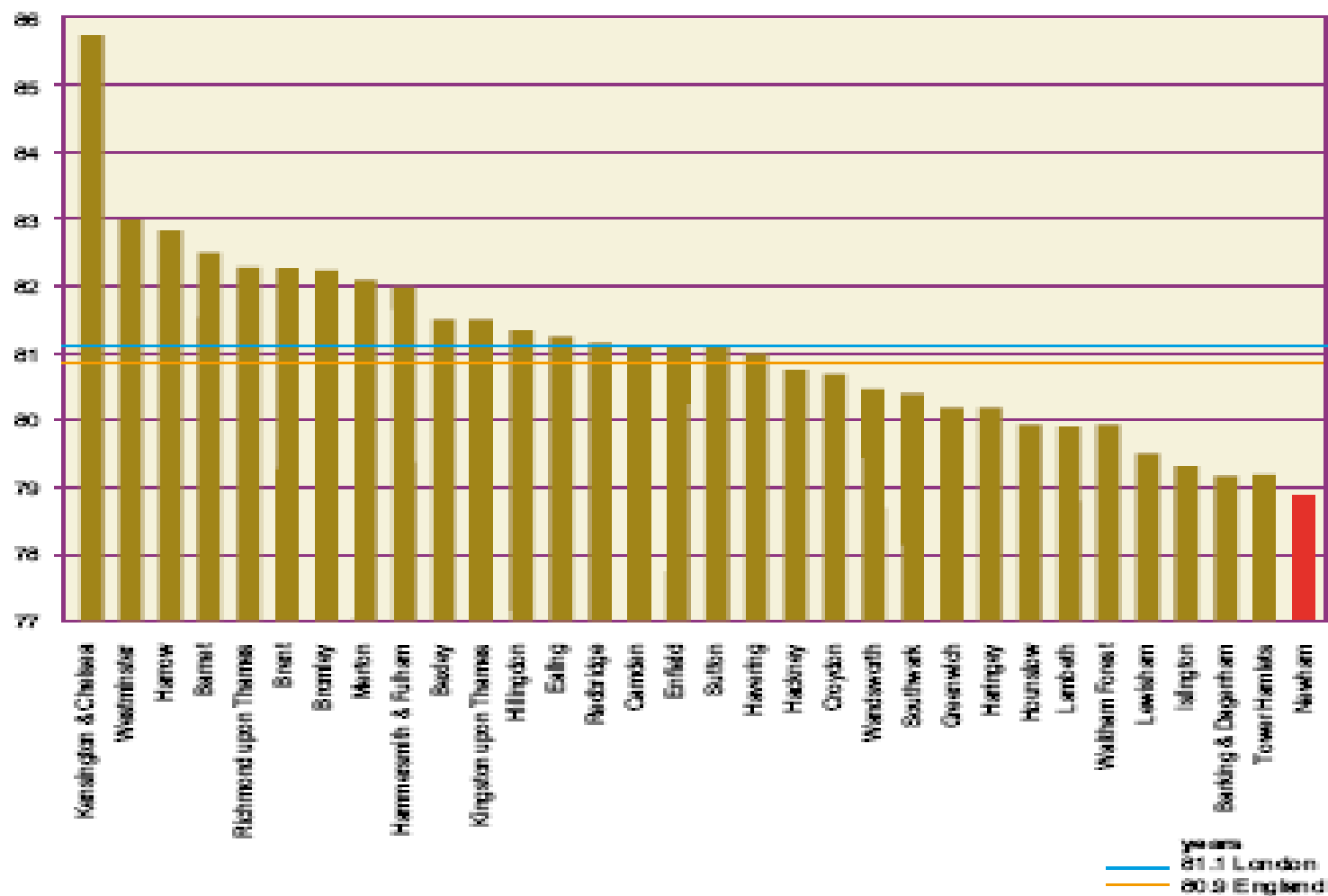
- Population 250,600

Ethnicity of residents aged under 15, Newham



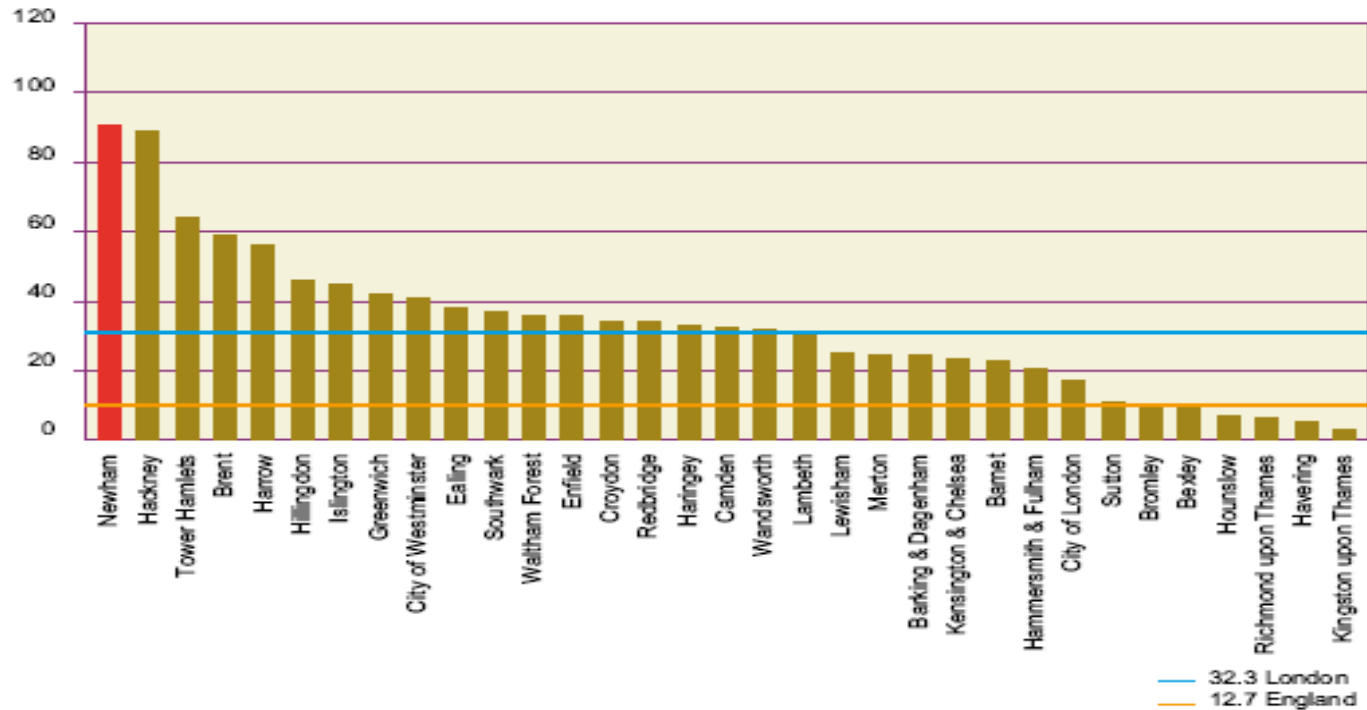
Female life expectancy at birth, London Boroughs 2002-04

female life expectancy at birth, years



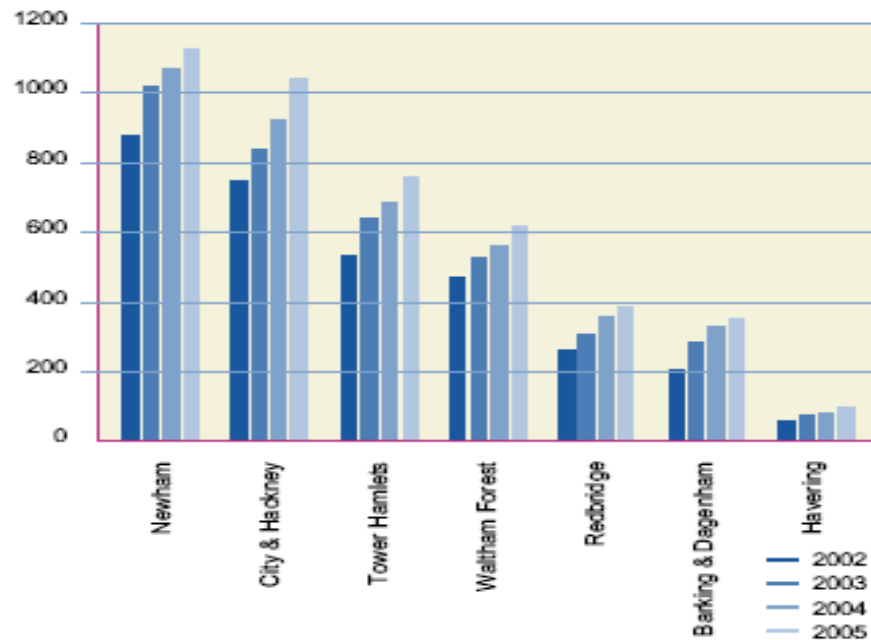
Tuberculosis notifications (all ages), London Boroughs 2004
